Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Create a positive sense of belonging regardless of gender, cultural and socioeconomic background.
- Assist in group security and safety when on excursions and away from the school.
- Encourage uniformity, pride and identification of students at sporting events.
- Represent the school in a positive image to the school population and wider community.
- Assist in bonding students and establish a strong school identity.

Aim:

To have a consistent school uniform that creates a sense of collective and individual pride in students and their identification with Carlton Gardens Primary School.

Implementation:

All students are required to wear the correct school uniform:

- During school hours (unless specified)
- When engaged in school activities, out of school hours or when representing the school in -
 - All sporting events.
 - School photo days.
 - Attending all excursions (excluding school camps).

The compulsory uniform is:

Summer:

- Blue, white and yellow check dress
- Navy skort
- **Unisex:**
 - Navy shorts or long navy pants
 - Aqua polo shirt with school logo, short or long sleeves
 - Navy quarter zip jacket with school logo
 - White socks
 - In Terms 1 & 4, all students are to wear the school approved hat

Winter

- Navy check pinafore with white skivvy
- **Unisex:**
 - Navy track-pants or long navy pants
 - White skivvy
 - Navy jacket with school logo
 - Aqua polo shirts, short/long sleeves with school logo

Footwear

- Runners, shoes or boots (must be closed toe) that are appropriate for physical activity

Approved Uniform (optional items):

- Navy leggings
- Navy bike shorts

- Navy scarf
- School bag
- Navy beanie
- Plain navy coat (no logo)

Items Not Permitted:

- Non navy leggings and tights
- Coloured windcheaters, jumpers, jackets, hats, socks and beanies.

Exemptions:

The principal or nominee may grant a temporary exemption upon receiving written application from, or following a discussion with the parents/guardians.

The principal may grant a permanent exemption in relation to headwear on religious grounds.

Non-Compliance:

An, "Out of Uniform Note" will be issued to any child who attends school out of uniform. This note requires parents to give a reason for their child being out of uniform. The schools welfare officer will keep track of these forms. The principal or nominee will request an interview with parents of students who are regularly out of uniform.

Evaluation:

The Uniform Policy was ratified in June 2019 and will be reviewed as part of the school's three-year cycle.
